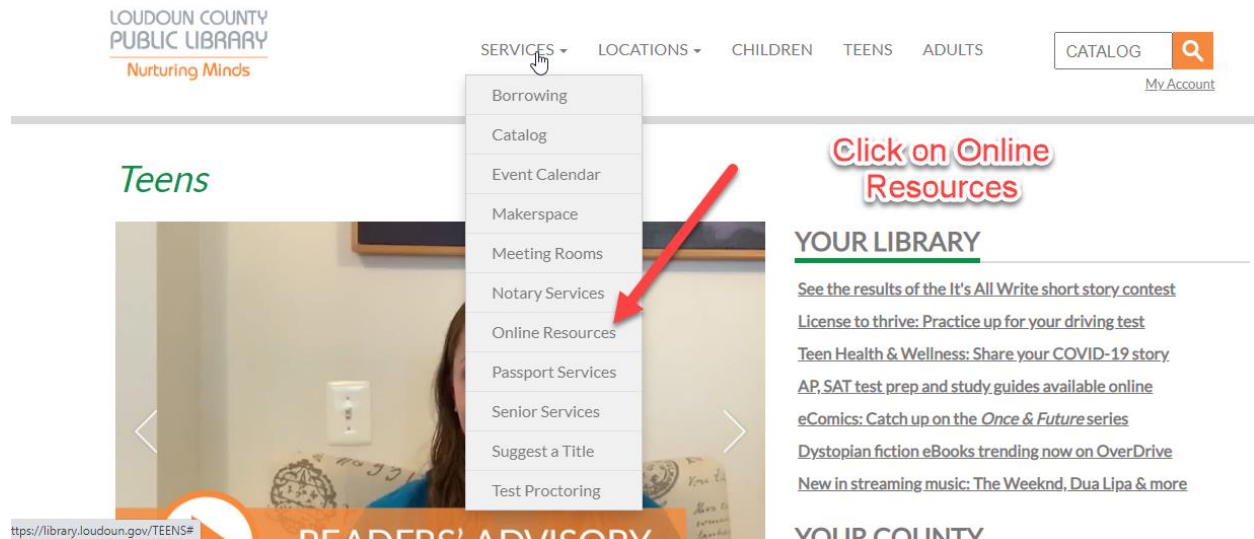


# How to get an ebook in Hoopla from Loudoun County Public Library

With Hoopla several people can read the book simultaneously.

First you will need to get a LCPL virtual card by filling out the application.

Download five songs per week and stream unlimited music 24/7. Choose from a collection of more than 15 million titles. Downloads are yours to keep and there's no...

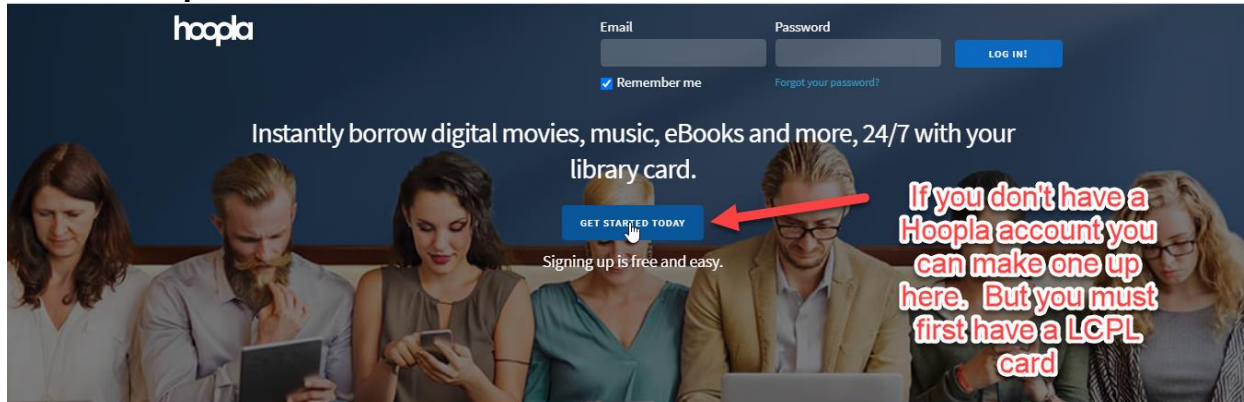
### hoopla

This streaming service offers over 30,000 independent films, documentaries and classics on demand. In addition, there's an entire site just for kids, plus over 5,000 Great

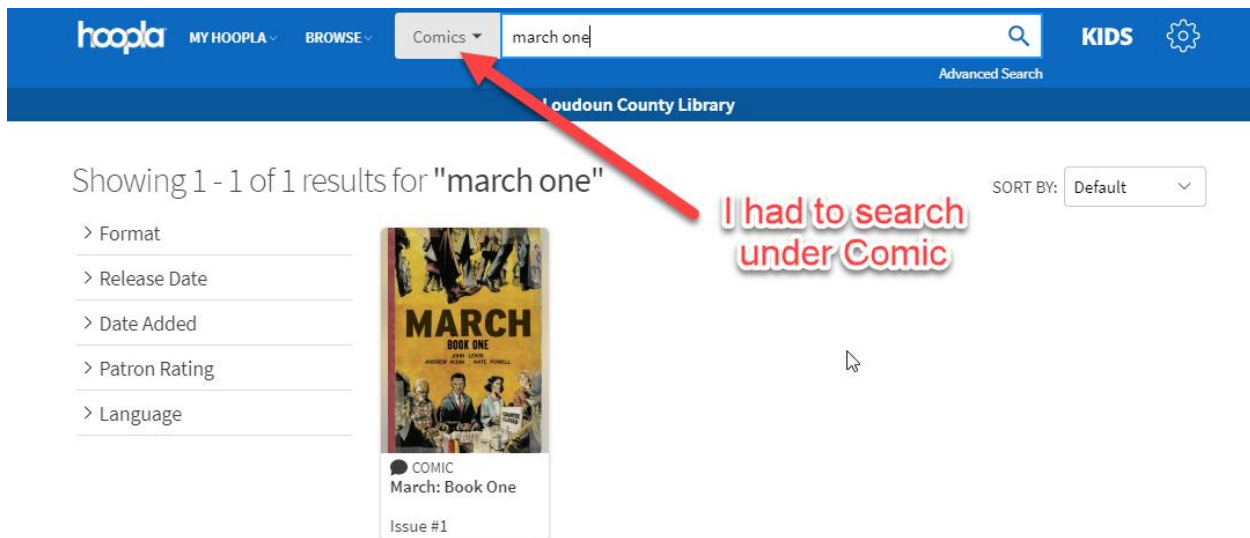
Once you are on the hoopla page if you have a hoopla account sign in. If not just make one up:

When you are logged into Hoopla you will need to search for your book. If you are looking for a Graphic Novel, you will need to search under Comic.

I had to search under **Comic** and I put the **Title** in as **March one**.



If I put in just **March** in the title I would end up with all the books in the series:
