Westfield High School - Four-Year College Application Checklist

Finalize your college list and decide how you're going to keep track of deadlines and requirements. There are options in Schoology in the College Application Tracking tools folder.
Fill out and submit Transcript Request Forms for each college to which you are applying as well as the Consent to Release Records Form . Submit at least 15 school days (3 weeks) before the application deadline.
Sign up in Naviance to attend college admissions rep visits to Westfield.
Request recommendation letters from counselor/teacher, if needed. Complete Counselor Recommendation Forms (Student and Parent) at least three (3) weeks before deadlines. The recommendation forms are in the Senior Folder of the Schoology Student Services Course.
Finalize essays and personal statements.
Apply by deadlines - many deadlines are in October, November and December. Do your research!
If you are submitting standardized test scores, send SAT/ACT scores directly from the testing companies to the schools – it can take up to 5 weeks for scores to reach colleges.
After you have submitted your applications, follow up to be sure colleges have received all required materials. Remember to check your email often for messages from your colleges. Consider creating a new email address just for your college and scholarship applications.
Attend one of the College Access Fairfax Virtual Paying for College Virtual Presentations on Saturday, October 28 or Tuesday November 14. Attend one of the Scholarship 101 Virtual Presentations on either Saturday, November 18 or Tuesday, November 28. Register here .
File your <u>FAFSA</u> (or the alternative <u>VASA</u>) after it becomes available in December and submit to schools before the college's Financial Aid deadline or "priority filing date." You may also need to submit the <u>CSS Profile</u> (available now), required by some colleges in addition to the FAFSA. A helpful resource for financial aid and scholarship information is <u>College Access Fairfax</u> .
Research and apply for scholarships through <u>Naviance</u> and other sources. Be sure to meet any college requirements concerning school-based merit scholarships such as separate applications, essays or deadlines.
